Recommendations

Mountains are a fragile and often unpredictable environment. For your safety :

- 1. *Never go alone***
Inform your friends and family of your route and of estimated time of return ; in case of emergency call 112.
- 2. *Be prepared with the right equipment***
Prepare good walking shoes, a hat, sunscreen, warm clothes, and a change of clothes. Take IGN maps 3336 OT and/or the map “Balades et Randonnées La Matheysine”.
- 3. *Check the weather forecast***
Check the weather conditions. Only leave in safe weather.
- 4. *Preserve the environment***
To protect the environment, close the gates of agricultural fences and keep your dog on a leash, do not pick flowers and take your rubbish with you.
- 5. *Herds and guard dogs (Patou)***
In the mountain pastures, adopt the right practices: make your presence known to the dog, go around the flock, let the dog come to you, and maintain a nonaggressive attitude. Dogs are not recommended or should be kept on a leash.

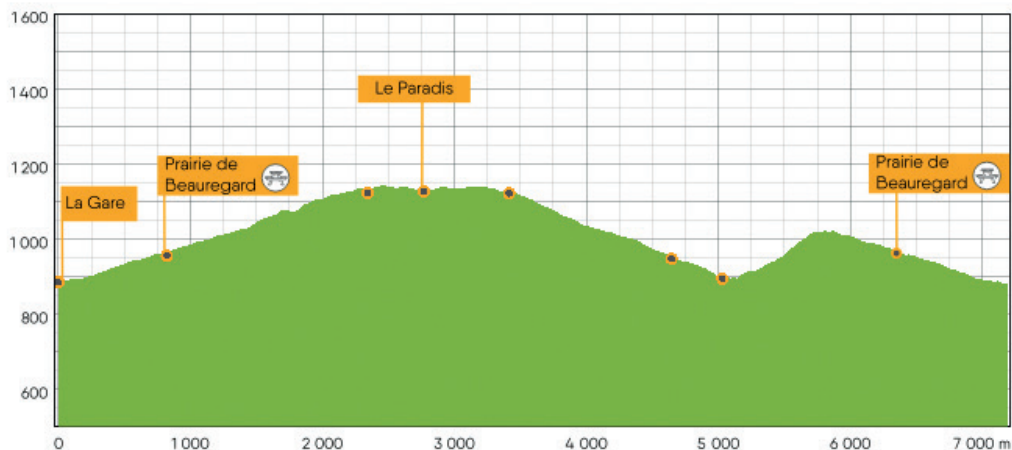
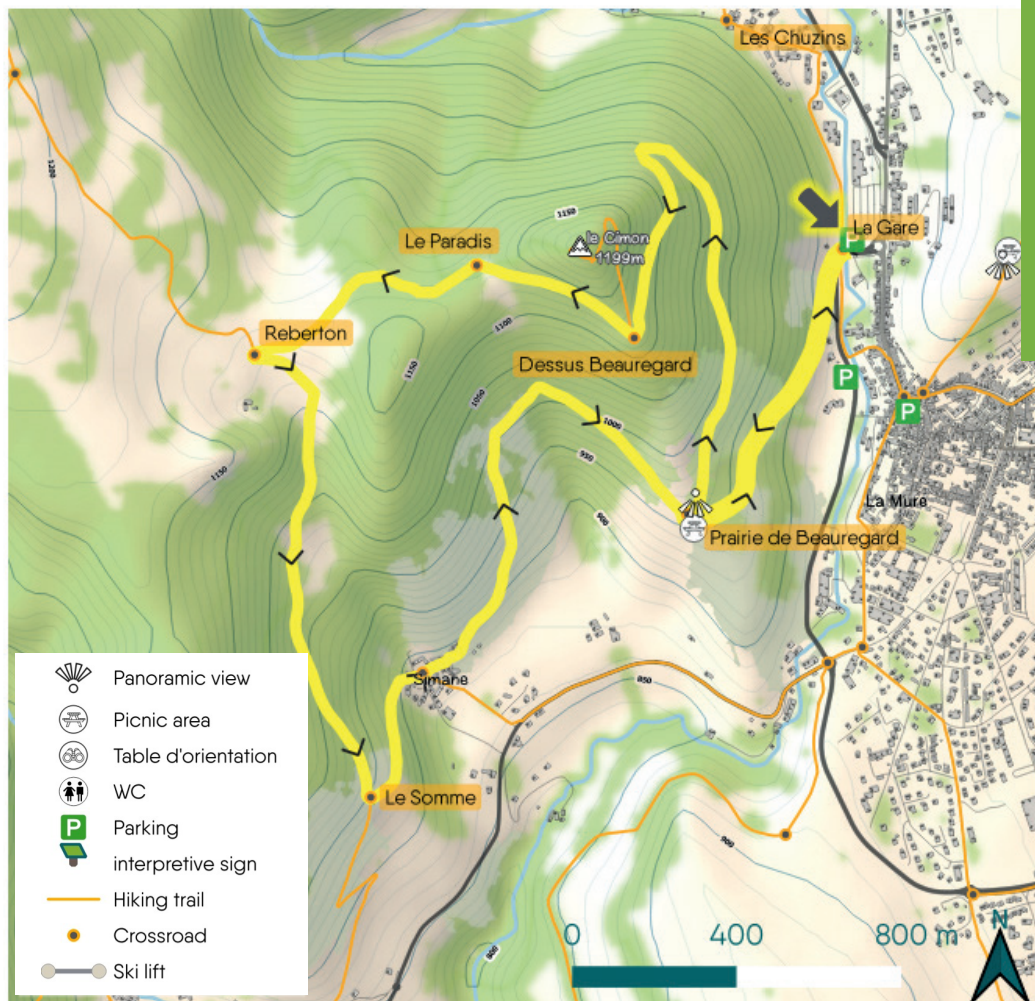

Les Ruines de Pellafole

This hike, reminiscent of the Southern Alps, leads to the discovery of the erosive phenomena that have carved the mountain and created the «coiffed ladies» (hoodoo rock formations).

Informative panels tell the geological and human stories of these reliefs so particular in the heart of warm pine forests and lake Sautet.

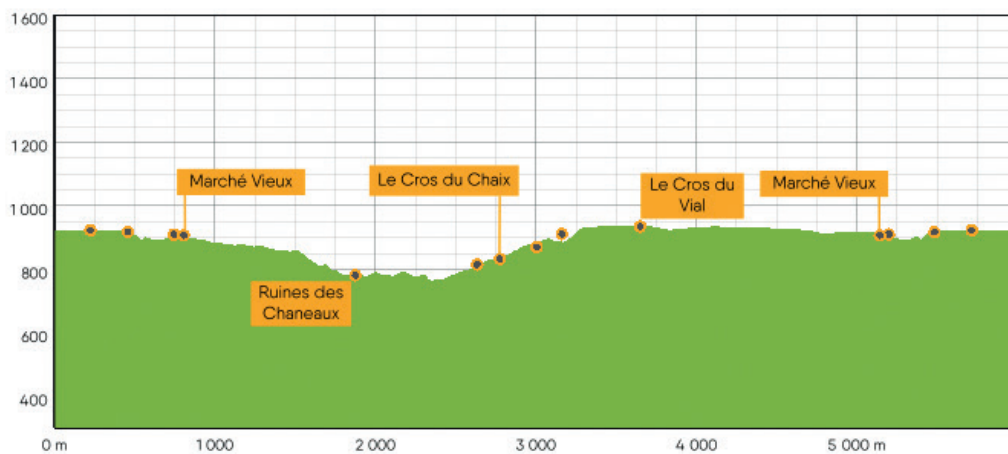
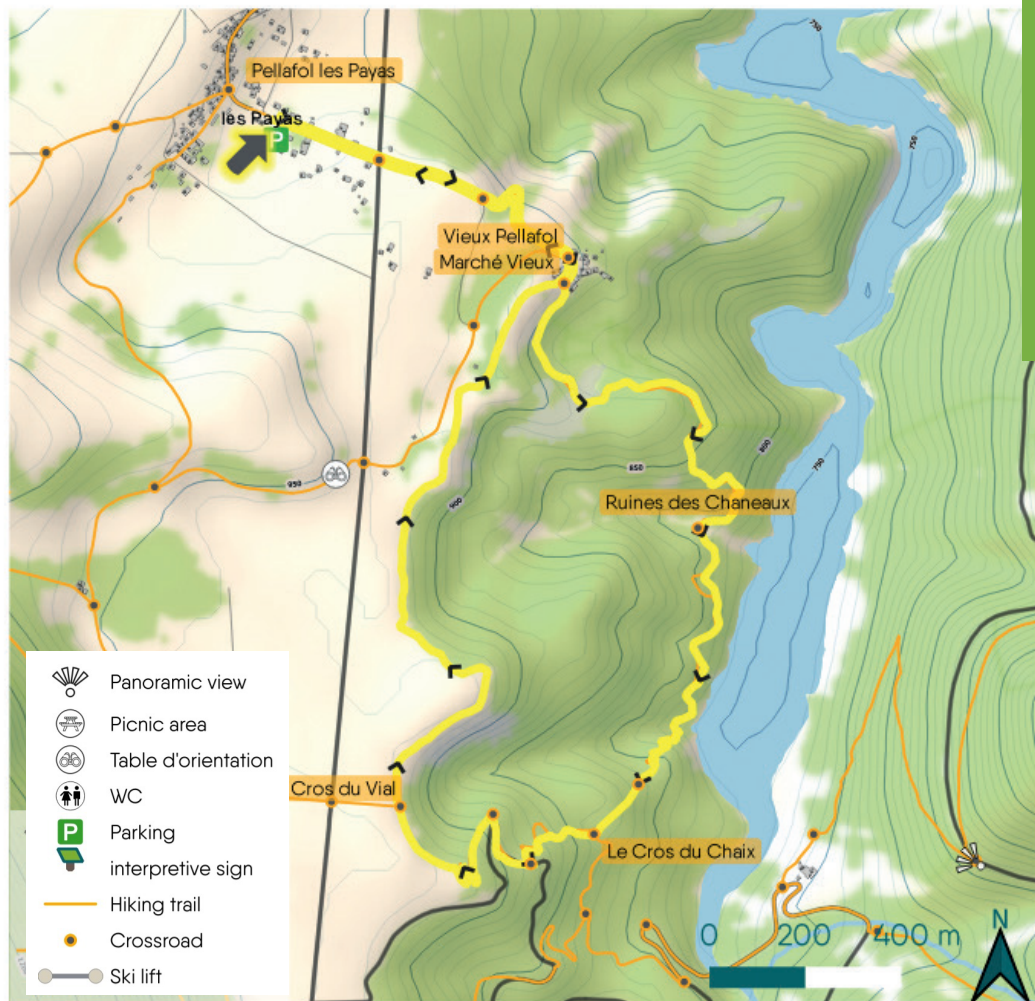
From the hamlet of *Les Payas* to the town hall, follow the direction of *Monestier d'Ambel* until Oratoire and then towards Vieux Pellafole.

From there, follow the discovery trail, passing by: *Marché Vieux*, *Ruines des Chanaux*, *Le Cros du Chaix*, then *Le Cros du Vial*. From there, return to *Marché Vieux* and take the same route back to *Les Payas*.

The extra information :

When you reach the agricultural plain, be vigilant for areas of steep erosion called *Les Ruines*.

Hameau du Rivobruenti

In the heart of the Armet massif, the Rif Bruyant valley and lake offer hikers the wild beauty of its landscapes, the fragrant scents of its valleys, and the unique character of its traditional architecture.

Connected to the Roizonne valley by a cobbled path, the little-known Rif Bruyant valley holds hidden treasures : explore the stone houses of the old hamlet with their slate roofs and stepped gables. Wandering through the beautiful hay meadows bordered by stone walls, you might stumble upon the icehouses, natural caves where the valley's cheeses were aged.

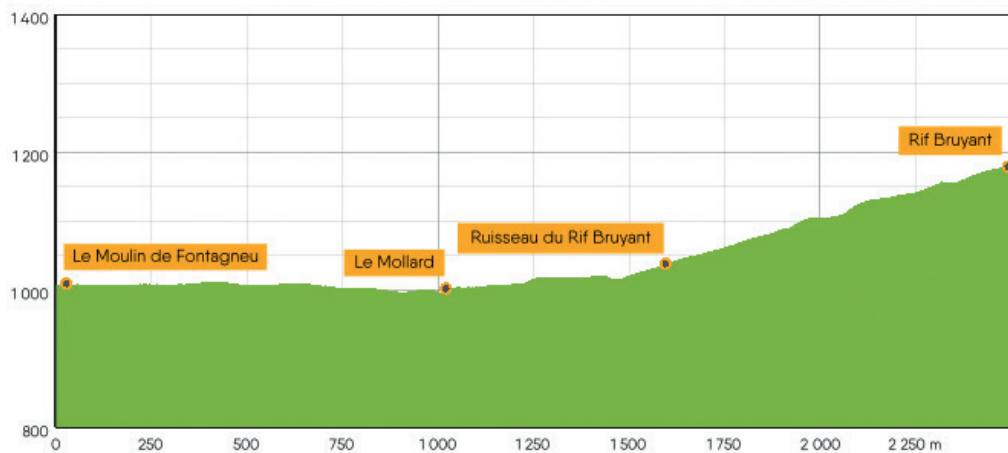
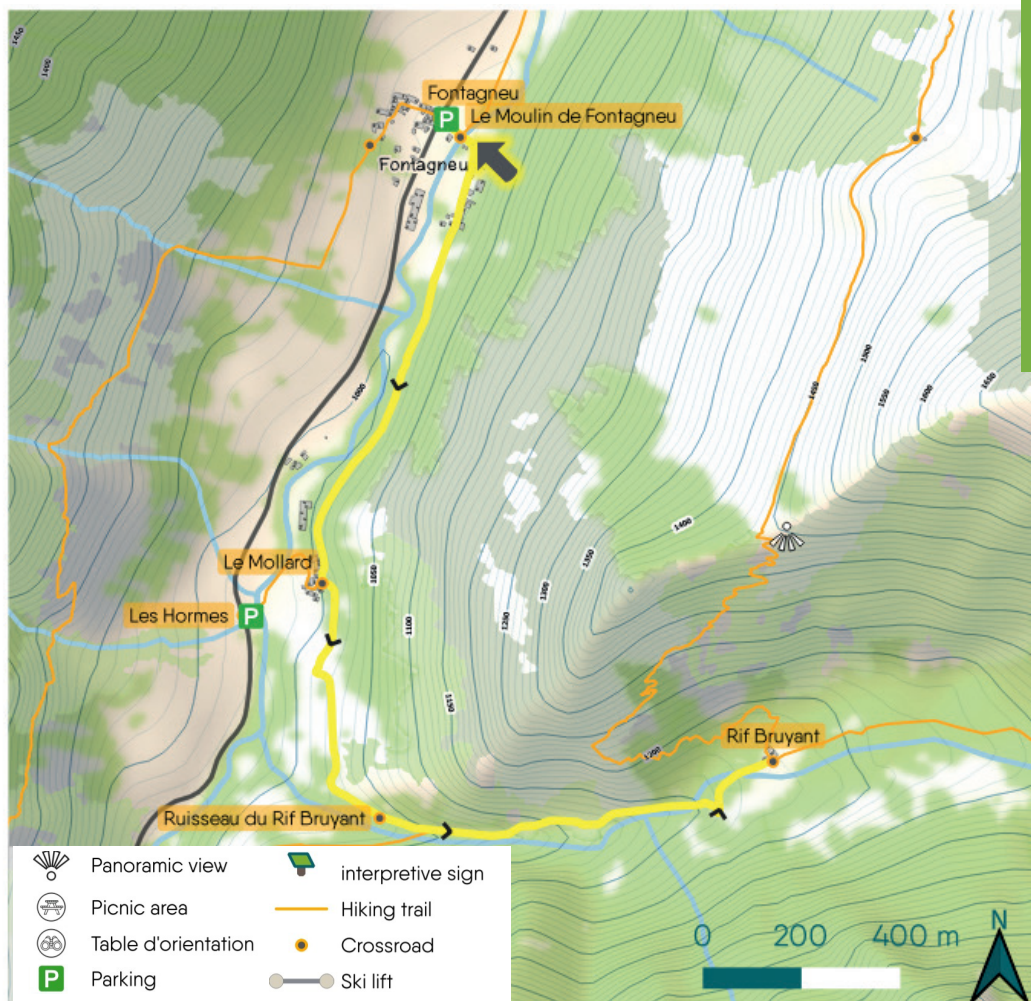
Path :

Park at the Fontagneu parking on the RD114. On the left as you leave the car park, at the signpost *Le Moulin du Fontagneu*, turn right towards *Le Mollard*.

At *Le Mollard*, continue towards *Lac de Rif Bruyant* through the undergrowth to the arched bridge. Do not cross the bridge, but continue uphill alongside the stream to *Vieux Hameau du Rif Bruyant*.

To go further :

For experienced walkers, it is possible to climb the narrow valley bordered by the cheerful meadows of Rif Bruyant until reaching the lake of the same name, hidden in the hollow of a wild and rocky cirque.



Plan Col

A beautiful trail starts in the Vaunoire Valley, between the Taillefer and Armet mountain ranges. Plan Col is an alpine pasture perched on a mountain pass that leads to Ornon and the Malsanne Valley. Between the Taillefer and Armet massifs, this hike, which ascends the wild Vaunoire Valley, will allow you to observe the different layers of vegetation and wildlife (blueberries, deer, marmots, and chamois). You will also have the opportunity to see the remains of the Grand Armet Glacier.

In summer, a shepherd leads his flock here, guarded by Mountain Dogs (Patous); please adopt the right actions (see page 3).

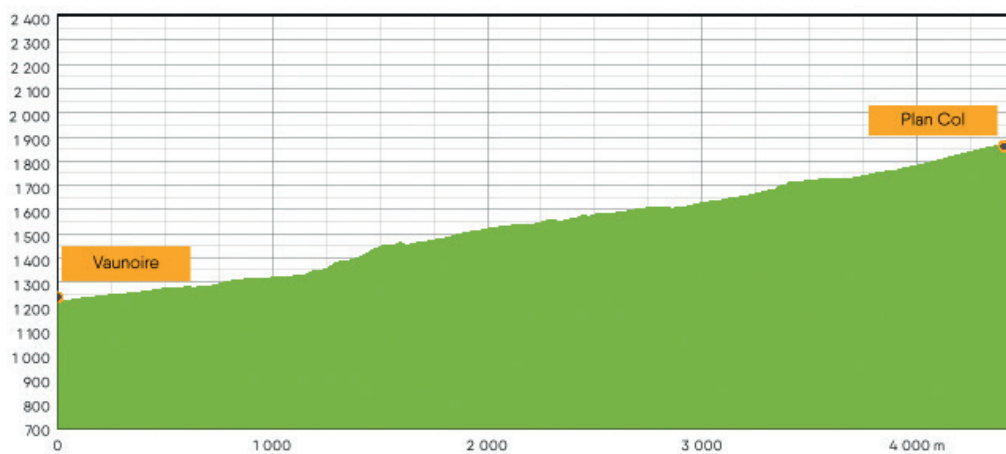

Parcours :

Start from Vaunoire's parking. Head East towards *Plan Col*. Ascend gradually through the forest to reach and cross the Vaunoire stream for the first time via a footbridge. Continue along the left bank (on the right as you ascend) of the Vaunoire stream. After passing below the *Cabane du Col*, cross the stream to begin a switchback climb followed by a short traverse across the slope to reach *Plan Col*.





Cabane du Louvet

A testament to local pastoral traditions, the Cabane du Louvet offers a magical setting for its visitors. It's a refuge to discover with the family, perfect for a picnic, a break, or even an overnight stay in the Cirque du Louvet.

Inside the cabin, you'll find all the necessary comforts: a table and benches for meals, a sleeping area for rest, and a wood-burning stove for warmth.

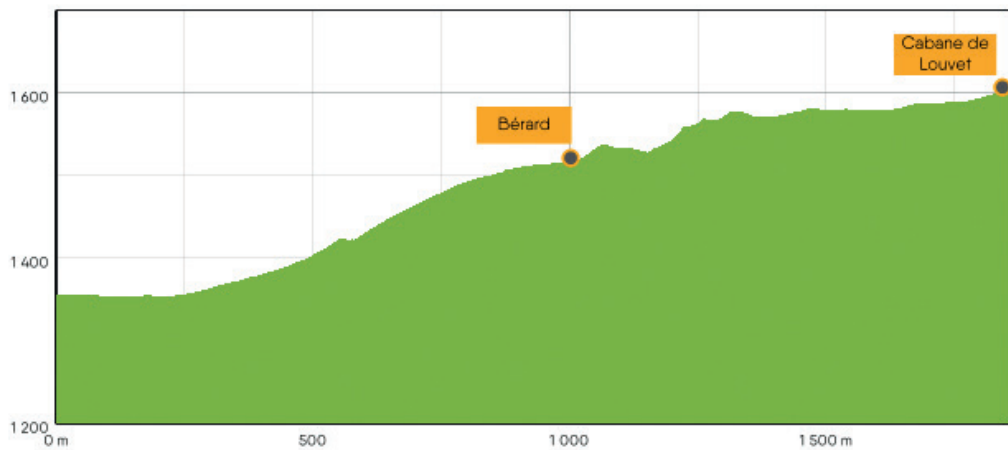
Path :

Turn right as you leave the parking and follow the road to the old Chalet du Club Alpin.

Turn right again and continue uphill to *Bérard*. From there, continue to the right through the undergrowth until you reach a large meadow, which you will skirt to the left until you reach the cabin.

Warning :

You are in a protected natural area. Please stay on the marked trails, keep your dog on a leash, do not light fires, and take your trash with you. Respect and preserve this place. Some sections may be vertigo-inducing.



Tour du Lac Mort

This family-friendly shaded loop around a little-known lake offers unique views of Grenoble area, the Chartreuse and Belledonne mountain ranges. The numerous boxwood hedges lend a mysterious atmosphere to this part of the trail. An ideal walk for a picnic!

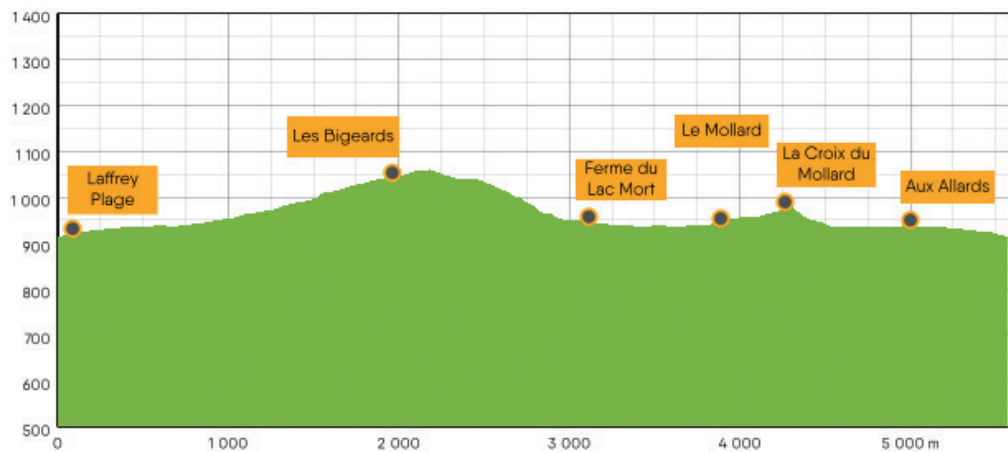
Laffrey is located 35 km south of Grenoble via the N85.

From Grenoble, take the A48 highway, exit 8, then follow signs for *Gap*, *Briançon*, *Vizille*, and *Stations de l'Oisans*.

Join the N85 via *Vizille-Laffrey* or the D529 via *La Motte d'Aveillans*.

From the parking, turn left and follow the road to *La Pivodière*. Turn left again towards *Les Allards*, then continue to *Les Bigeards*. From there, descend to *Ferme du Lac Mort*, continue to *La Fretta*, then climb up to *Les Tibanes*. Turn right towards *La Croix du Mollard*, then descend to *Lac Mort* and reach Laffrey beach via *Les Allards* and *La Pivodière*.







Sentier de l'eau

In this austere valley, the inhabitants have exploited the beneficial and destructive force of water to irrigate, saw and also produce electricity. The association *Mémoire Battante* extends and celebrates this ingenuity by keeping the swing saw alive, by restoring and developing mountain orchards and becoming the transmitter of these skills. This thematic trail is their work.

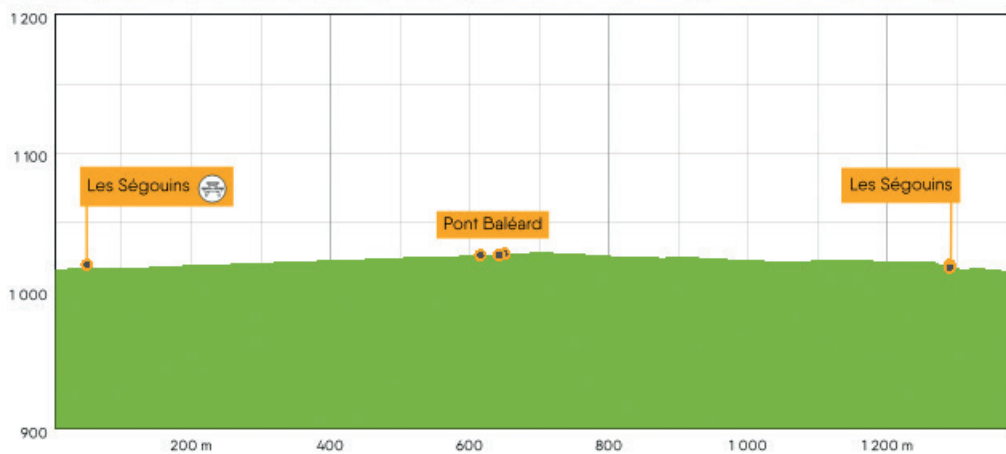

Path :

From the old Scie Battante, along the river to the *Pont Baléard* passing through the old orchards restored and developed by the association *Mémoire Battante*.

There, cross the river and turn left to go back down the course of the Bonne until you reach *Les Ségouins*, which you will reach by crossing the Bonne again



Cascade de la Pisse

Discover a typical valley of the Ecrins National Park with its mineral world, its many wild waterfalls and its river, La Bonne, with fresh and clear waters.

After a pleasant walk in the middle of fields, you will arrive at the foot of the impressive cascade de La Pisse and its 80m high. The bravest can climb higher and soak up the mineral world of granite at the cabane de la Pisse, with its views of the Olan and the Font Turbat valley.

Path :

Departure from the car park located at the entrance of the *Désert-en-Valjouffrey*. Cross the village towards Font Turbat. Cut the GR54 by crossing the river of La Laisse by the wooden bridge. Take the large path in meadow along the Bonne. Walk at the bottom of the waterfall, by crossing the torrent of the same name thanks to a footbridge. To climb up to the belvedere above the waterfall, continue until a pannel indicating the direction of *Basse Pisse*.

Pour aller plus loin :

Continue the walk towards the *Refuge de Font Turbat*.

Distance: 18,6 km (round-trip, go : 9,3 km)
Elevation : 900 m + / level : a bit difficult
Estimated time : 4h for the ascension.

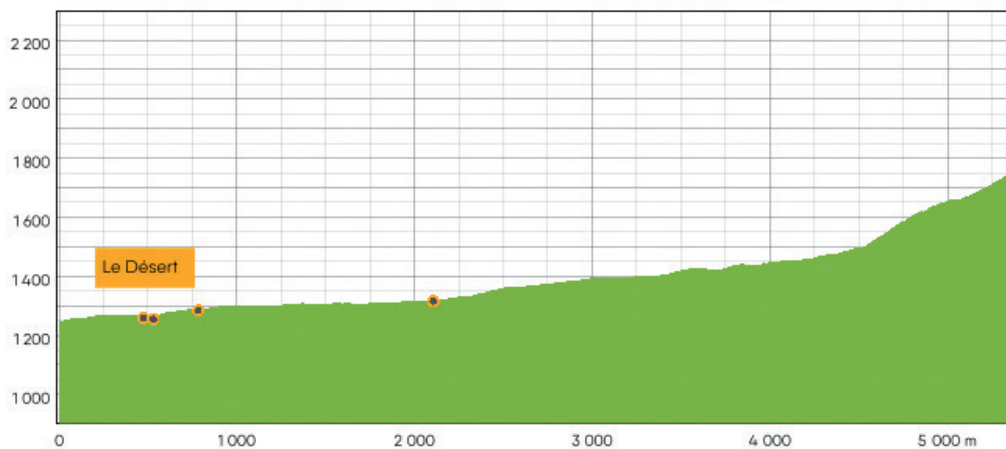
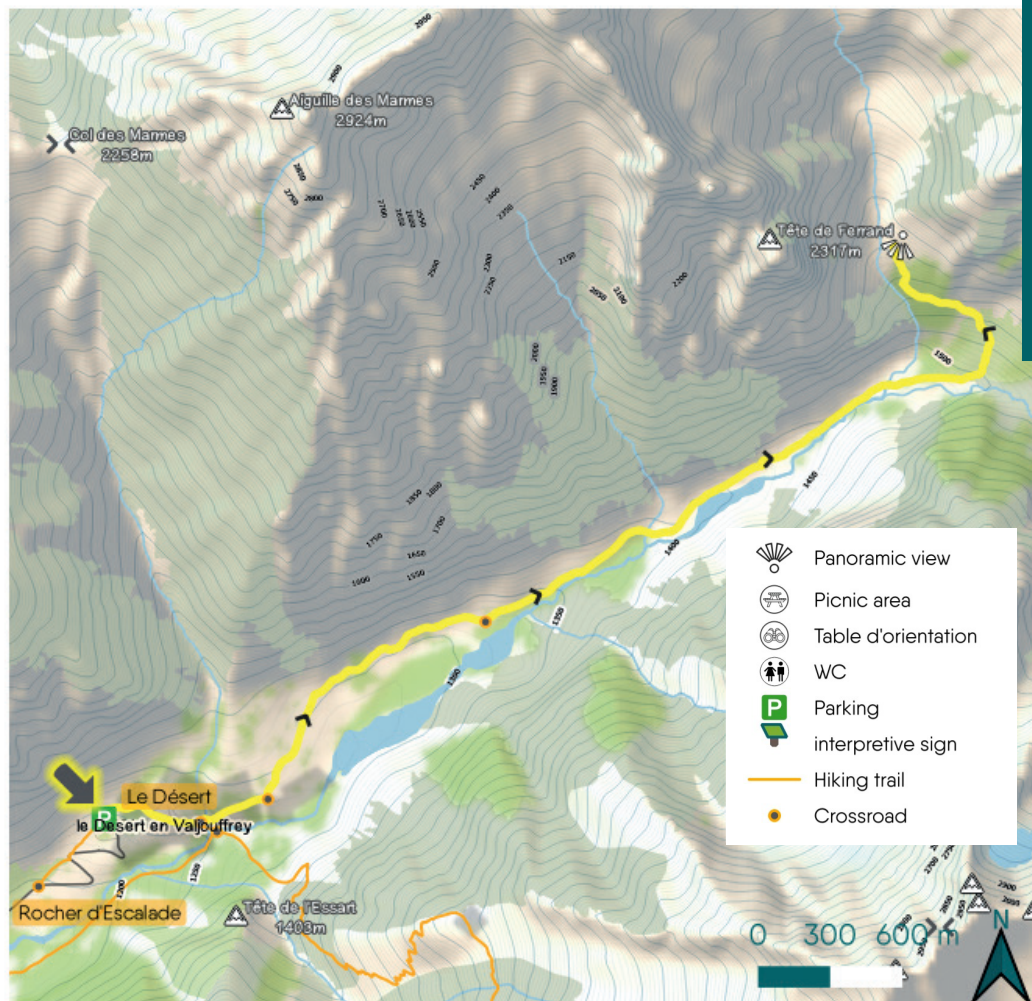

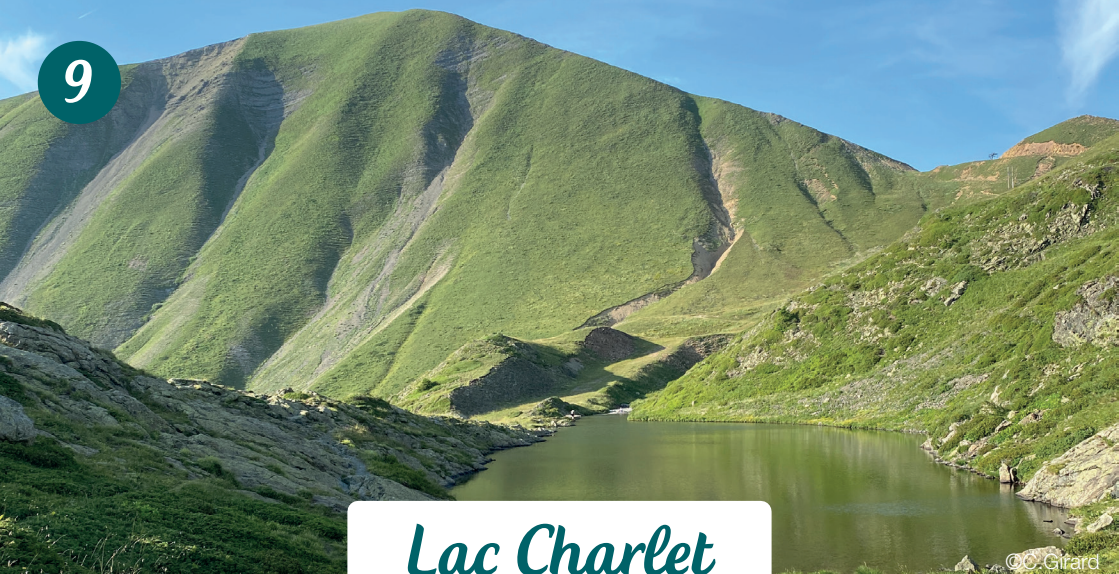

Lac Charlet

Departing from St Honoré 1500, La Chaud, enjoy a beautiful family hike with a splendid view of the Matheysin plateau and its lakes as well as the eastern barrier of the Vercors.

On the western flank of the Tabor which dominates the Matheysine plateau, this small mountain lake reflects the ravine slopes of the Perollier and hosts, in summer, a colony of tadpoles.

You will cross several types of landscapes: an ascent in the fields and in the spruce forests, then a rockier crossing to finally come out on the small humid and welcoming plateau of Ollière.

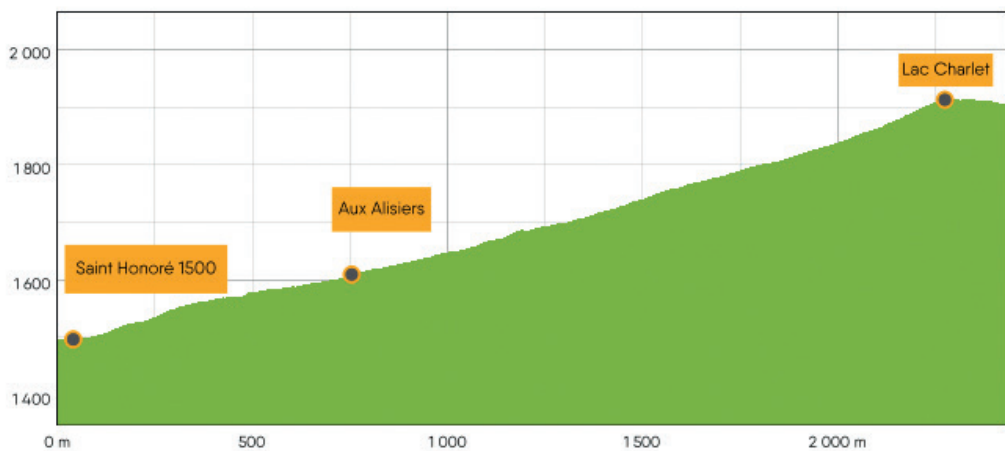
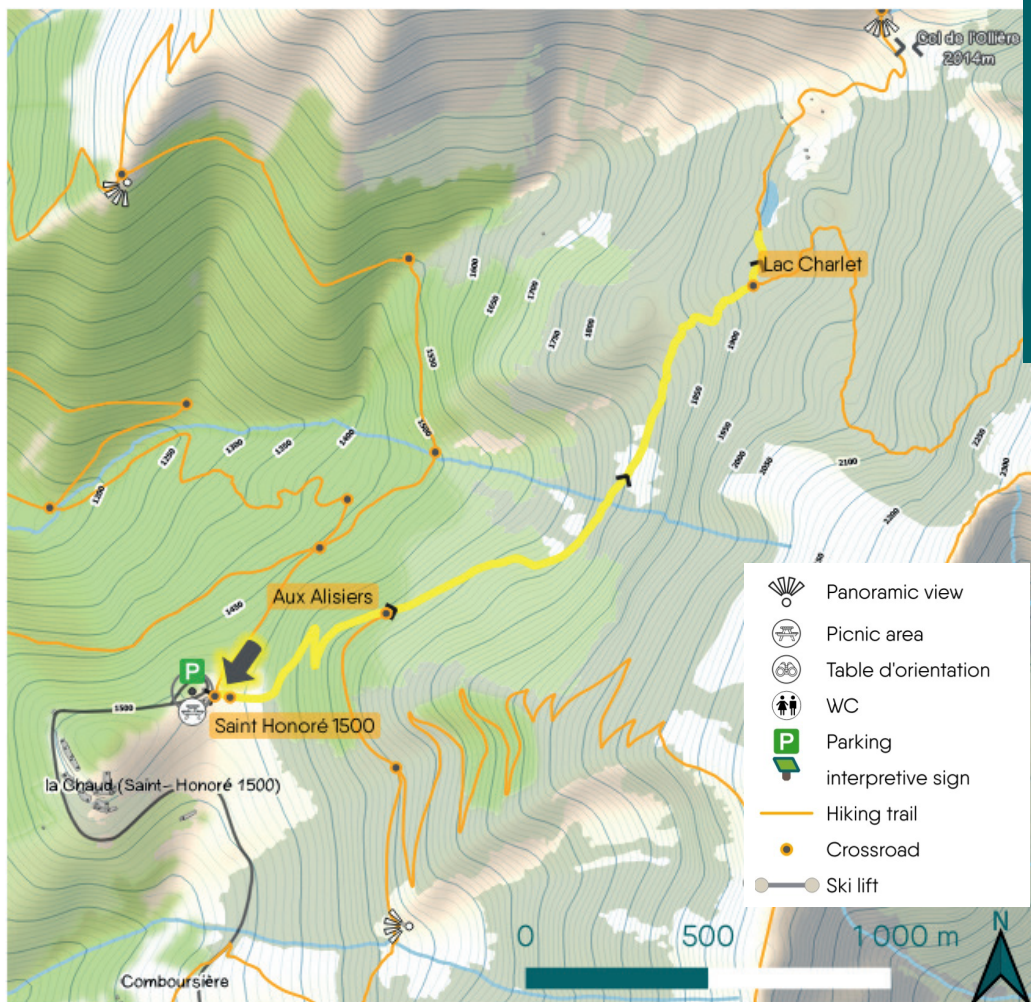

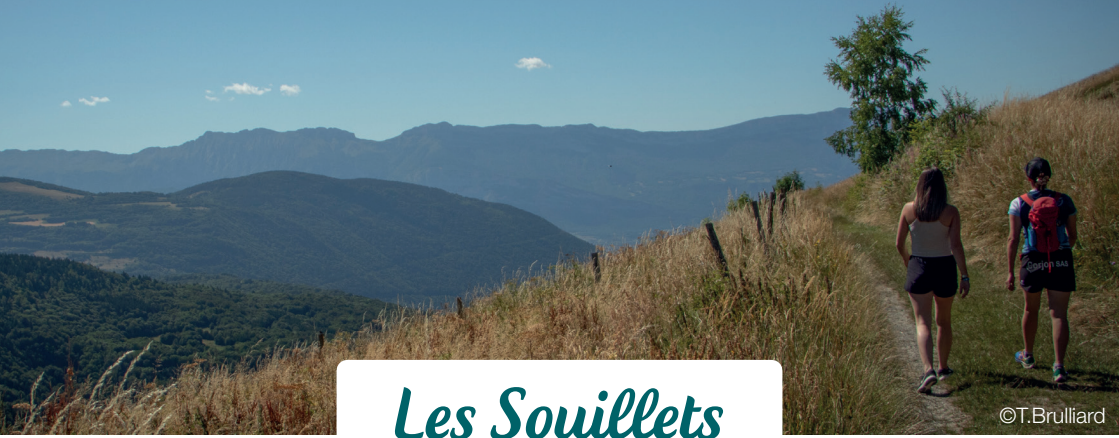
Departure Sain-Honoré 1500, take direction of *Lac Charlet* by the ascending path in the fields then in the forest to *Aux Alisiers*.

The path goes out in the vegetation to start the crossing of Banc and Tabor flanks. A small plateau will lead you to the Lac Charlet at 1920m over the sea level. Way back by the sale way.

The extra information :

In the 1960s, a ski resort project was imagined (Saint Honoré 1500) with a link to Alpe du Grand Serre, opened in 1988. The real estate project was stopped in 1993. The ski resort will last until 2004 , the ski lifts were dismantled between 2005 and 2007.

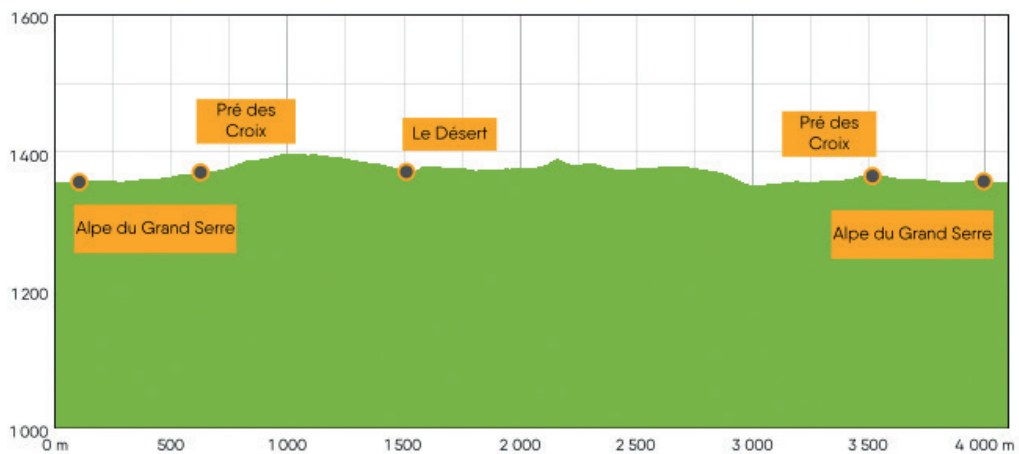

Path :

From the camper park in front of the body of water, go to the ski resort and at the goose leg Alpe du Grand Serre take the right road towards *Le Désert* by the *Pré des Croix* and *Champ de la Fond*. At the *Désert*, the path will make you turn around *the Colline des Souilletts* to the *Pré des Croix*. From there, reach your departure point.







Lac de Brouffier

Set off to conquer Lac du Brouffier, a wild mountain lake with crystal-clear water. The entire route offers breathtaking panoramic views. On the way back via the Côte des Salières, you'll feel like you're walking above Grenoble, almost flying !

Path :

From the ski resort, take the *route du lac du Poursollet*. After nearby 4km, park your car at the fourth hairpin turns. From there take on your right the flat path called *Bonniot* (forbidden direction sign) which arrives at the *Cabane du Louvet* (place where wolves were) and one the small Prévourey lake. Once at the cabin, take the path in front of you : the Brouffier's lake is also announced on the left trail, it will be your way back.

Cross the dale towards the back of the hollow ; a trail attacks with determination the slope in the axis of the river. While the slope is weakening, the trail is coming closer to the river and cross it. In some switchbacks on the other shore, it swallows the rock bar of the lake of which it joins the spillway by a last cross on the right. The comedown goes by going along the lake on the left side (you see the trail) and away from a cabin where starts the way back. Keep following the trail which goes up and go down to the hiking.

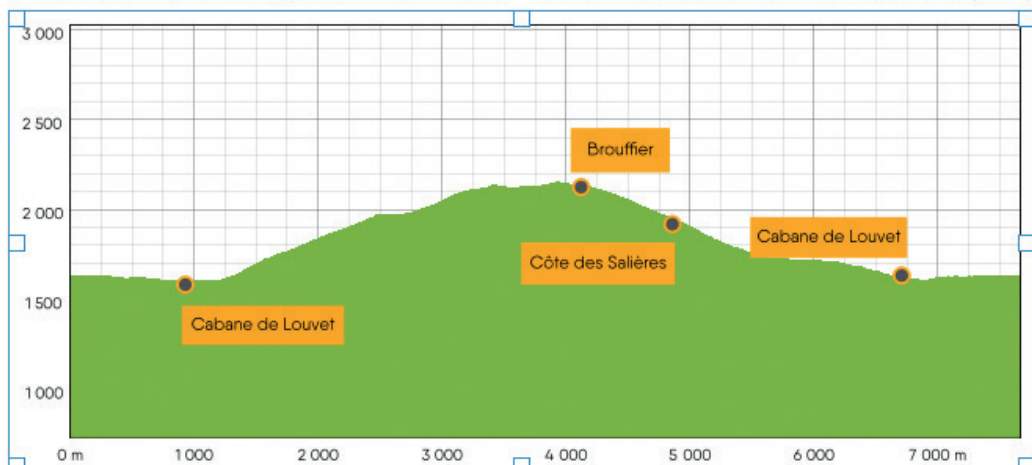

Passerelles himalayennes

Come and enjoy a unique experience on this lovely loop around Lake Monteynard-Avignonet and its turquoise waters. Discover the two Himalayan footbridges spanning the Drac and Ebron rivers and enjoy the thrills !

Path :

We strongly advise you to take the «La Mira» boat from the Savel pier to the Treffort pier. There is a charge for the crossing, so please book well in advance on the La Mira boat website.

The crossing of the lake is commented, and information on the history of the lake and the footbridges is provided.

The hike starts directly at your arrival ion Treffort pier.

The extra information :

The Drac bridge is 220 meters long, and the Ebron bridge is 180 meters long. There are several picnic areas and dry toilets available along the way.

If you don't want to do the full loop : it is possible to do a round-trip to the Drac footbridge at the departure of the paying parking lot of Savel.

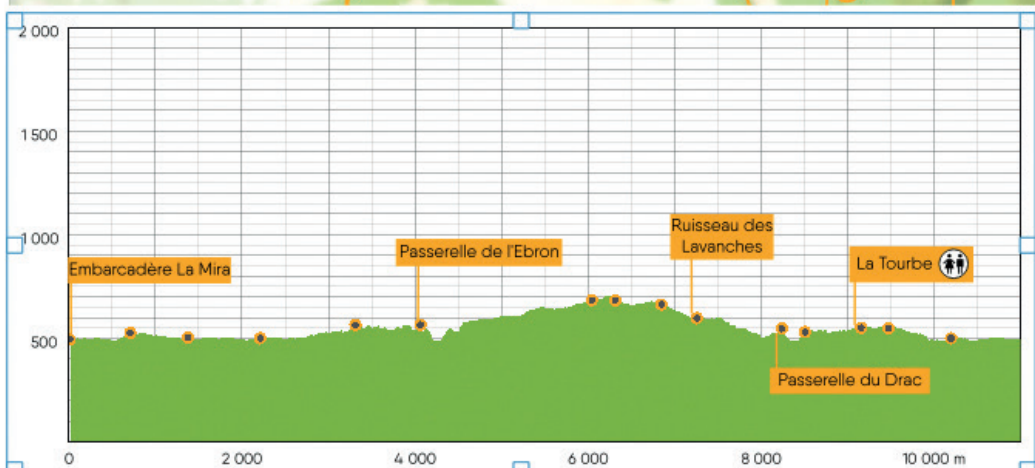
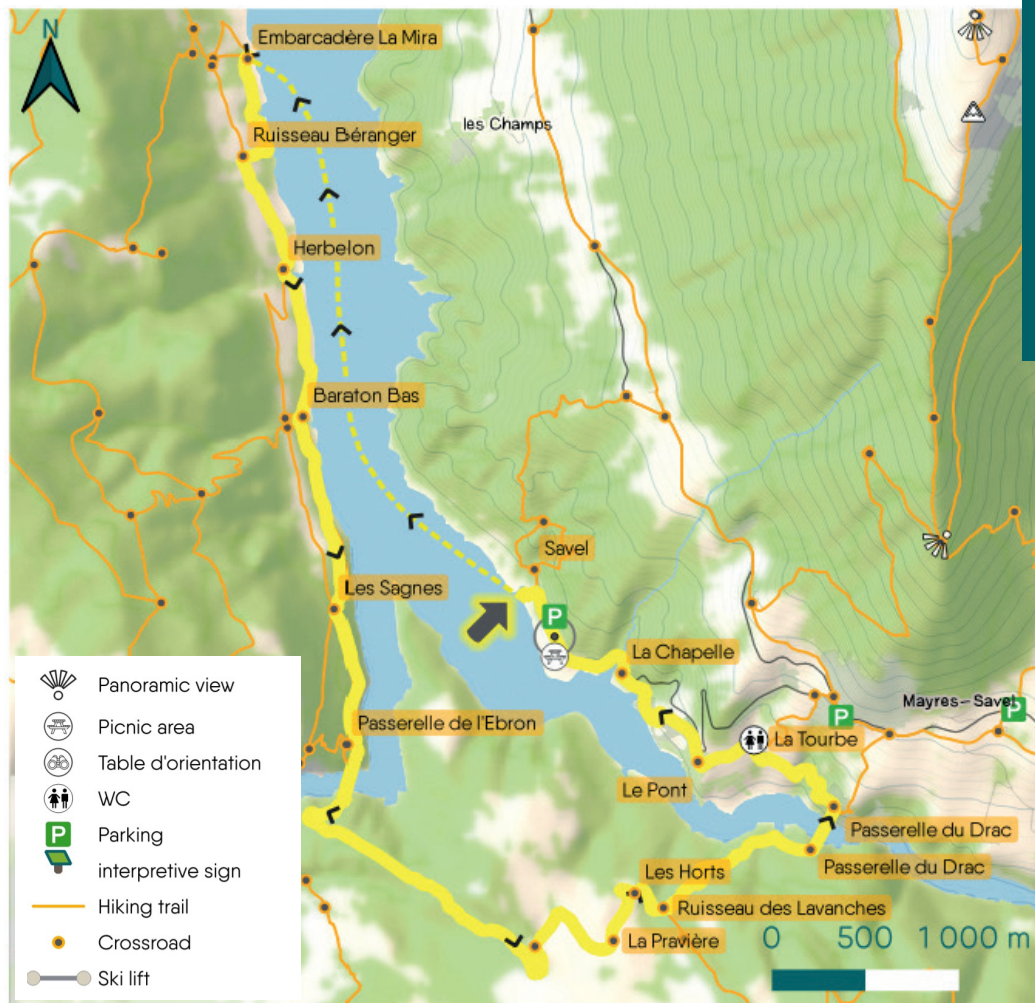

Sommet du Gargas

Join this easily accessible summit which will reveal a 360 ° view of the Ecrins, Vercors and Dévoluy massifs. The orientation table will lead you !
By going down from this great ascension, take time to immerse yourself in the serene atmosphere of this high place of pilgrimage.
Recommended visit to the basilica with the modern works from Arcabas.

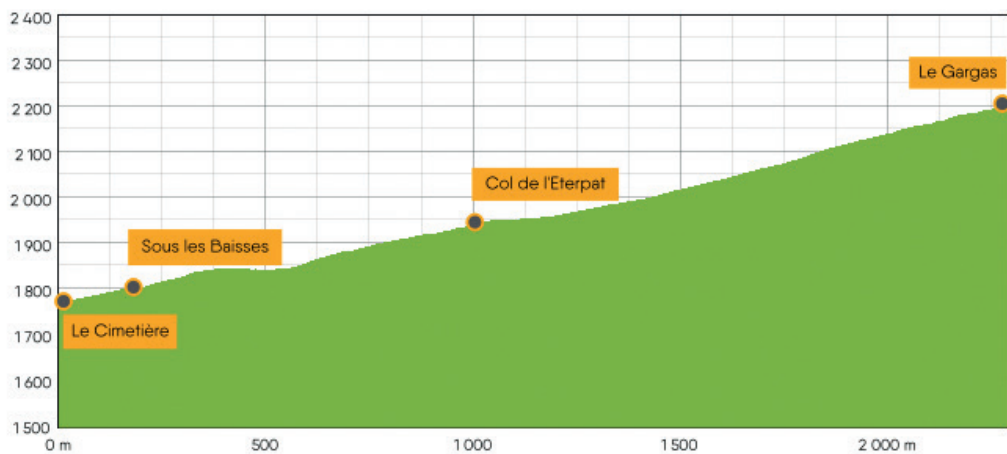
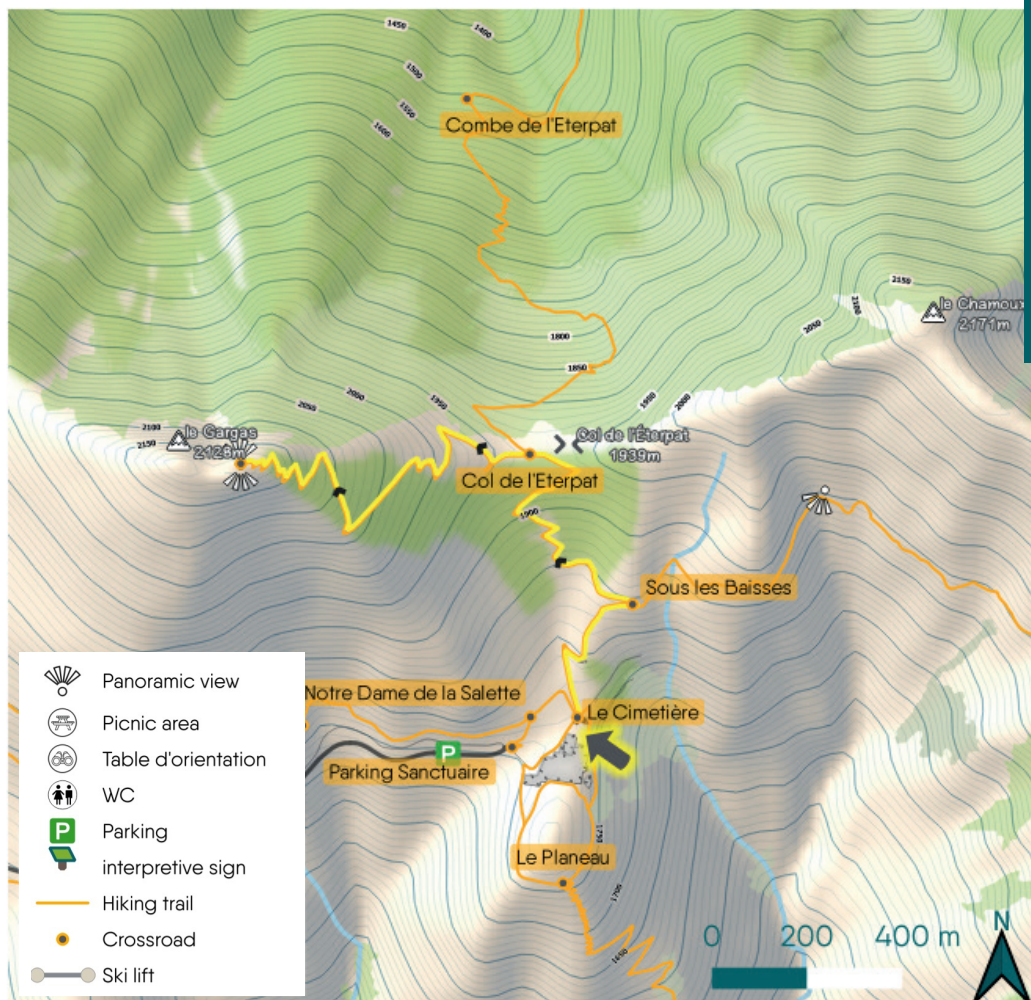


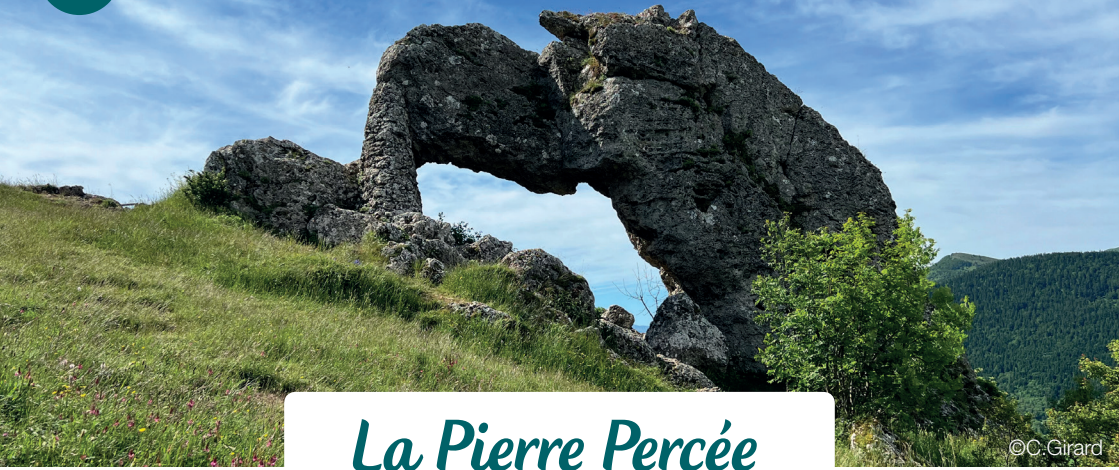

Path :

From the forecourt of the sanctuary, head towards the cross, then go up towards cemetery, walk along it and reach *Sous les Baisses*.

There, go left to reach the forest of protection against avalanches planted by the ONF services under *the Col de l'Eterpat*. Arrived at the pass, take left again to start the final ascension. A path in laces will lead you to the panoramic summit of *the Gargas* and its vertiginous cliff.





La Pierre Percée

This hike will take you to the Pierre Percée, one of the seven wonders of the Dauphiné : a natural arch situated 1220m above sea level, symbol of a legend between Devil and Duke. Enjoy a stunning view of the Matheysine plateau. The route also passes through an underbrush which is pleasant in summer.

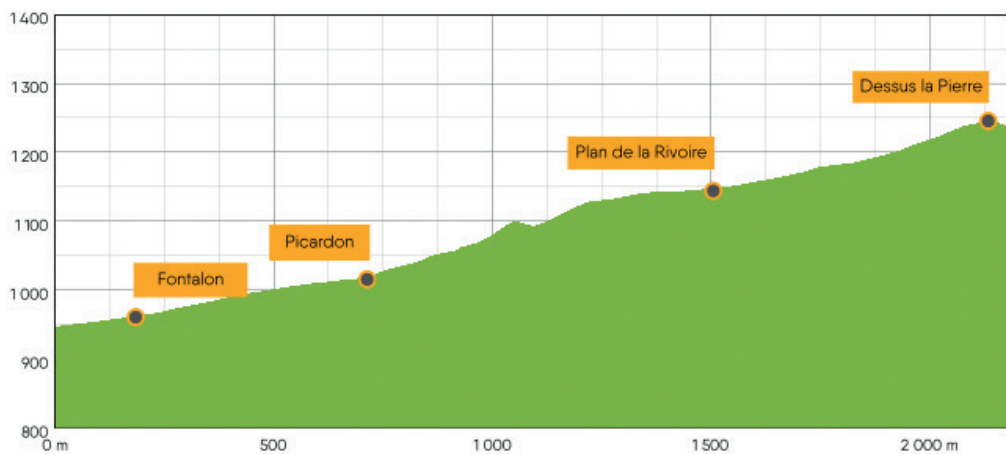
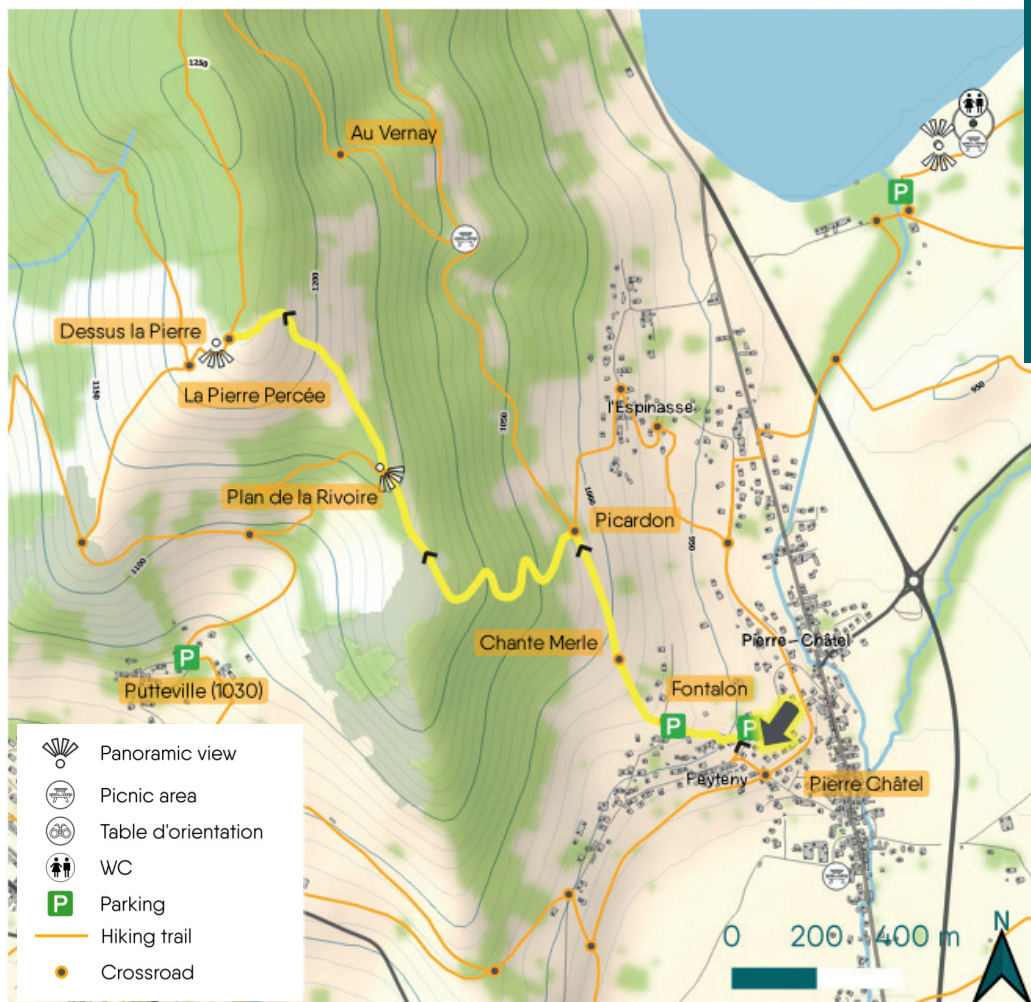
Park in the Fontalon car park in Pierre-Châtel.

Go straight up in the direction of Chante Merle until you reach the old charbonnière de Picardon. Turn to the left for a few switchbacks to Plan de la Rivoire. Continue straight on to reach the spectacular Pierre Percée. The return is done by the same route.

Variant with departure from *La Motte d'Aveillans* :

Departure from the car park *Les Georges* at La Motte d'Aveillans. Follow *La Pierre Percée* by crossing *Roche Corbeyre* and *Serre de Lozier*. Way back by the same path or by *Plan de la Rivoire*.





Crêtes de la Sciau

After a balcony approach at the rythm of the sweetness of life in the Beaumont, you will discover that the sweet reliefs offer some 360° panorama that a worth visiting.

A large section of the ridge trail gives you the impression of hiking between two different landscapes: on one side the granite and dark Ecrins; on the other the limestone massifs of Vercors.

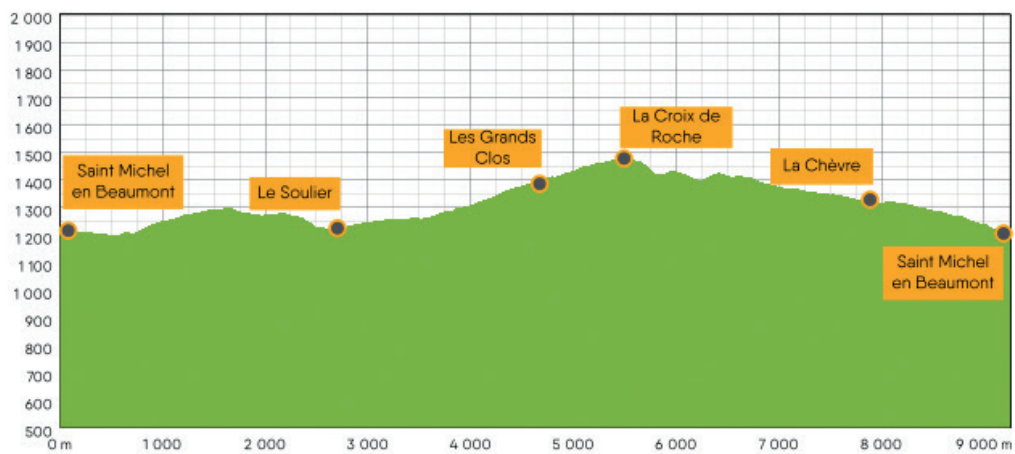
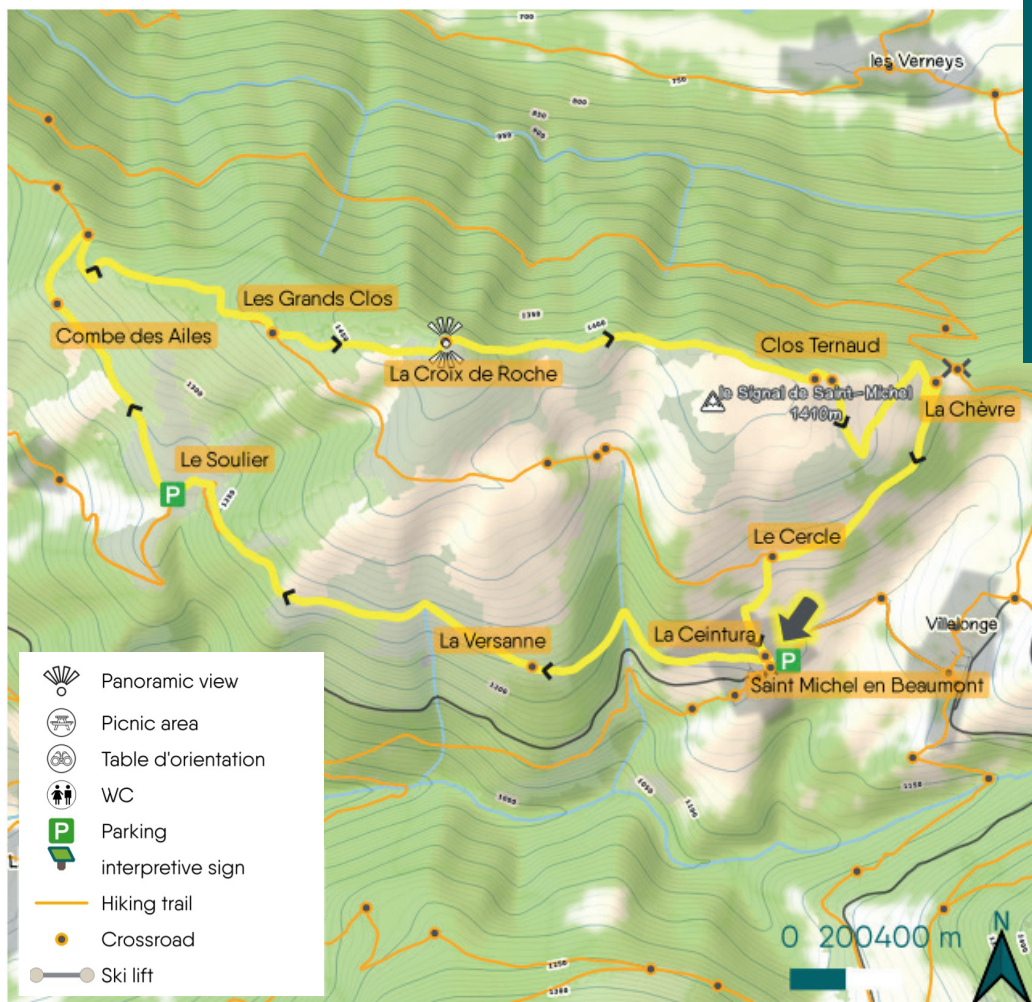
Path :

Departure *Saint Michel en Beaumont*, Church car park, follow *La Ceintura*, then *La Versanne*, *Le Soulier*, *Combe des Ailles*, *Les Grands Clos* and *La Croix de Roche*. Continue to *le Clos Ternaud*, *La Chèvre*.

From there, reach *Saint Michel en Beaumont* by *Le Cercle*.

The extra information :

Discover the majestic panoramas and the ridge line adorned with Scot pines. Cows are in estive, period of the year when the herds graze on mountain pastures.

If the Senepi welcomes during summer more than a thousand bovines, it offers also to hikers an exceptional panorama above the greatest european organized alpine pasture. From the belvedere, we can believe to touch the Obiou while revealing the Taillefer, the Mount Aiguille, The Olan...

Departure from the car park *Les Merlins*, 2km from *Susville*. Follow the direction of *Bergerie de Mayres* passing by *Écurie Bernard*. From the *Bergerie*, reach the *Col du Sénépi*. Way back to *the Merlins* by *Le Grand Lau*, *Les Treize bises* & *Pré Rambaud*.

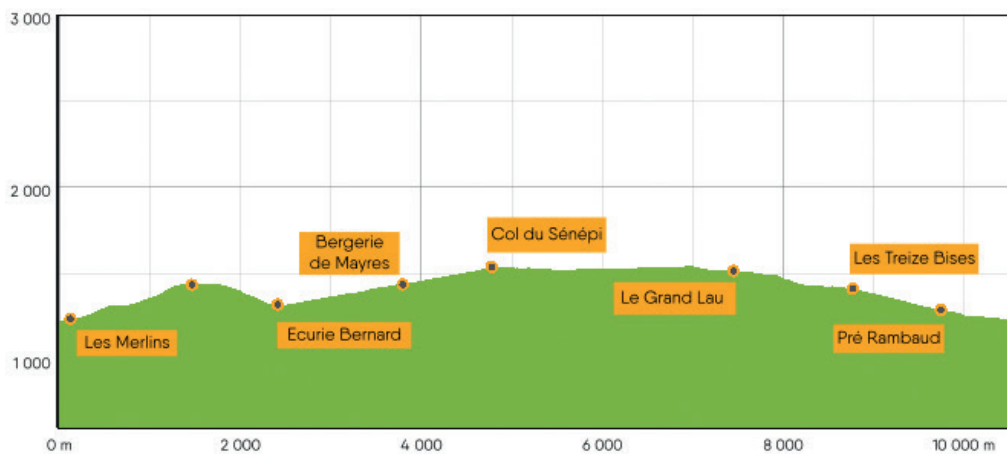
You can enjoy a stop at the cottage of the *Treize bises*.

Climb up to the *Sénépi* summit culminating at 1769m over the level of the sea, where an orientation table will help you to discover the surrounding mountains at 360° (1-2h)

The extra information :

This pasture is home of heifers that you will surely meet.

Close the gates, keep your dog on a leash, stay on the paths so as not to trample the grass: these actions allow you to respect the peace of mind of the herd and the work of the shepherd, a passionate man who ensures that the animals and walkers live together in harmony.

The path climbs behind the Salle Hors-Sac to start with laces in underbrush.

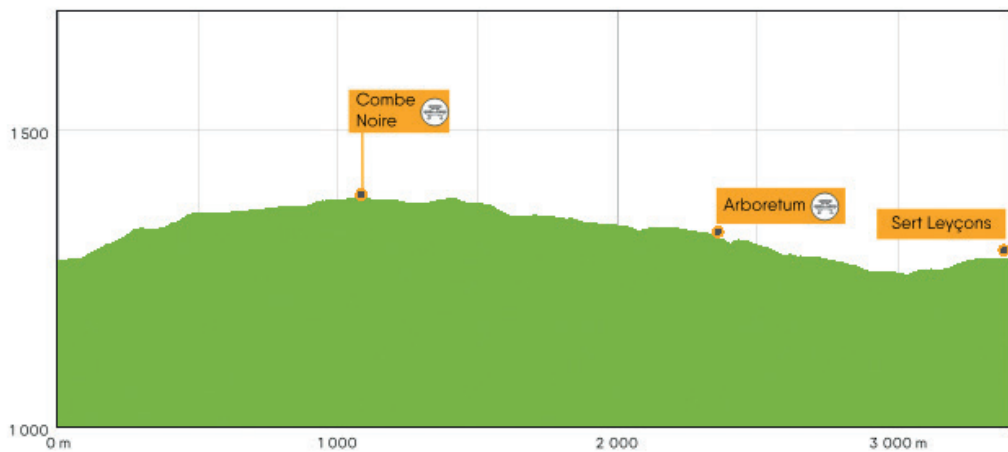
After finding the way for some hundred meters, you'll enter in the common portion with the Arboretum.

A descent in laces brings to a clearing and a panoramic table. The way back goes below and a sweet ascent brings you back to car park.

The extra information :

Societies change and landscapes adapt but keep the memory of time for those who know and take the time to see.

Sometimes you just have to turn back to try to imagine life as it was, the mountain as it was, and what the women and men of that time were experiencing.





La plaine de Valbonnais

Walk across the vineyards of Valbonnais, passing by the Fayettes covered bridge and leading to a body of water. The path crosses some typical hamlets of the valley and allows you to discover, on the way back, the remains of a mound from the Middle Ages.

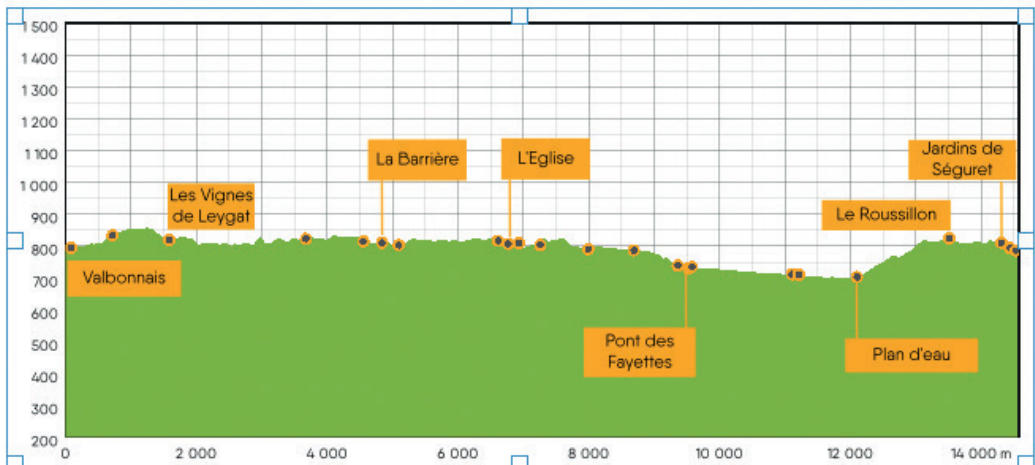
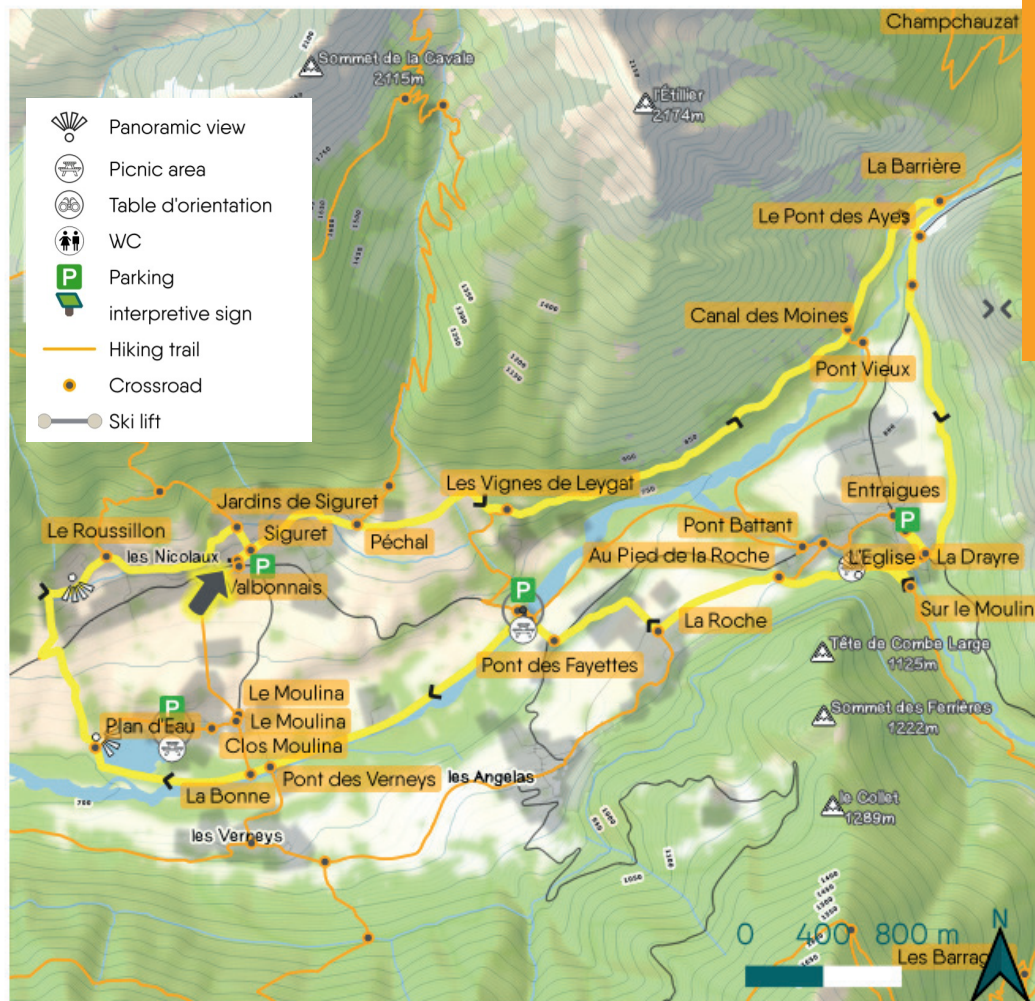

Path :

Departure from the school car park. Climb the main street over 100m until the Valbonnais crossroad. Take the small inclined plane on your right towards the Pont des Fayettes, up to the Vignes de Leygat along a beautiful hollow path. At the *Vignes de Leygat*, turn left to join the Canal in the direction of *Le Périer*. Follow the *Canal des Moines* until you reach *La Barrière*, then go down on the right towards *Entraigues* to arrive at the church. From there, follow the road on the left to La Drayre then go down on the left to cross the *Bonne* and go up in front until you reach *the Moulin*.

Take the path on the right to reach a beautiful rock as a belvedere. (Be careful! The entrance to this belvedere is quite discreet, on the right as the path becomes level, but the view will reward you!). Continue towards the *Pied de la Roche*, *La Roche* and the *Pont des Fayettes*. After crossing the bridge, a wide path will lead you to the body of water of *Valbonnais*. Going up, join the Departmental Road, go down for 100m and take on the right the path passing by *the Roussillon*, *the Gardens of Siguret*, then *Siguret*, until your starting point.





Canal du Beaumont

This bucolic walk in the undergrowth invites you to walk along a canal almost 150 years old, a heritage jewel that still irrigates Beaumont from the Valbonnais.

Path :

Get out of the car park and descent the road over 50m until the *Pont Vieux* crossroad.

There, take the path softly climbing along the left of the house and reach the canal to follow this one on the right.

Arrived on the road, walk along it on the left to reach the canal on your right until *Sous Côte Rousse*.

You can walk back from here or plunge on your right to continue the journey by descending to *La Salle en Beaumont*.

Start the ascent to the *Canal du Beaumont* and reach *Sous Côte Rousse* for returning to your departure.

A round-trip variant is also possible.

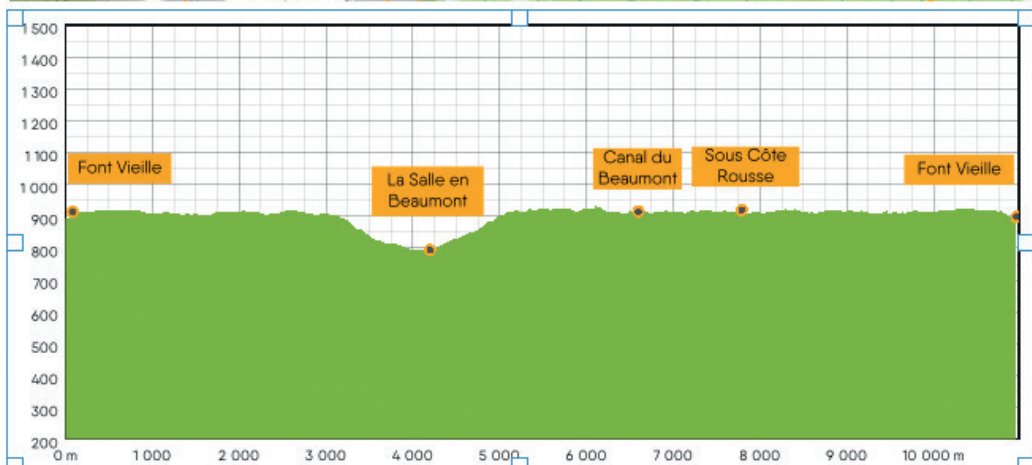

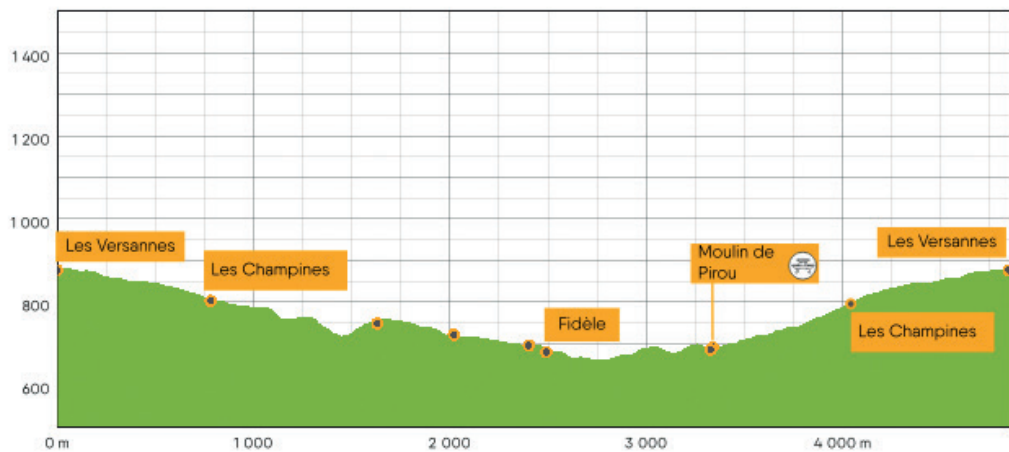
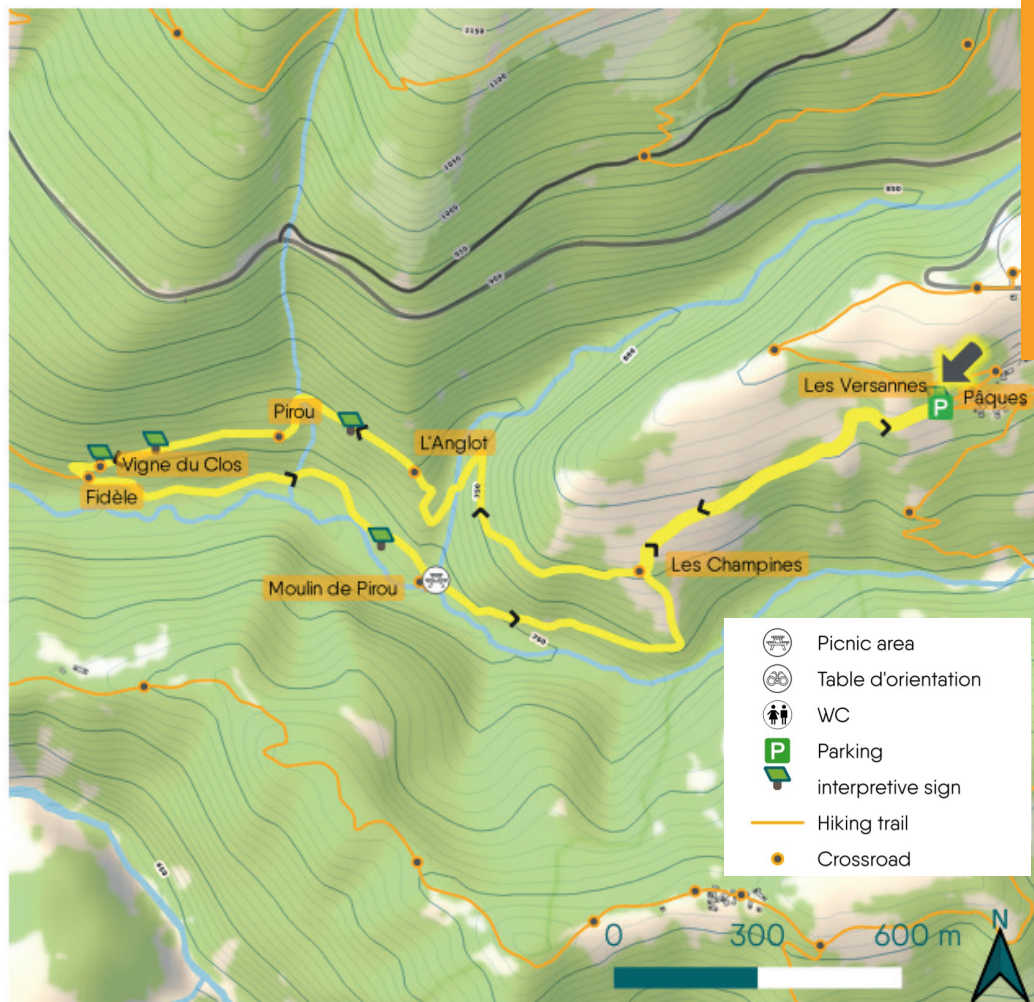
Path :

From the *Hameau de Pâques*: follow the direction of Le Four then the Sézia themed path. Pass through *the Versanes, the Champines, Anglot, Pirou, Vignes du Clos, Fidèle, Moulin de Pirou* and go up towards *the Champines* and towards *Pâques*.

Warning :

Do not enter in the old windmill remains : stability of stones is not insured.

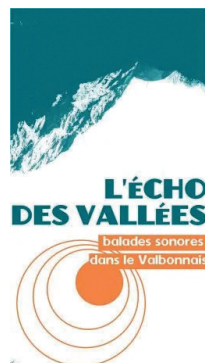


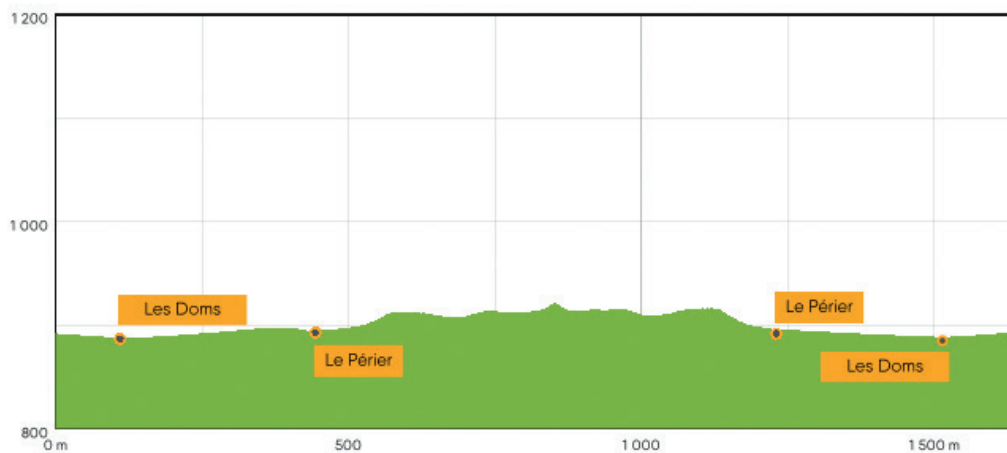
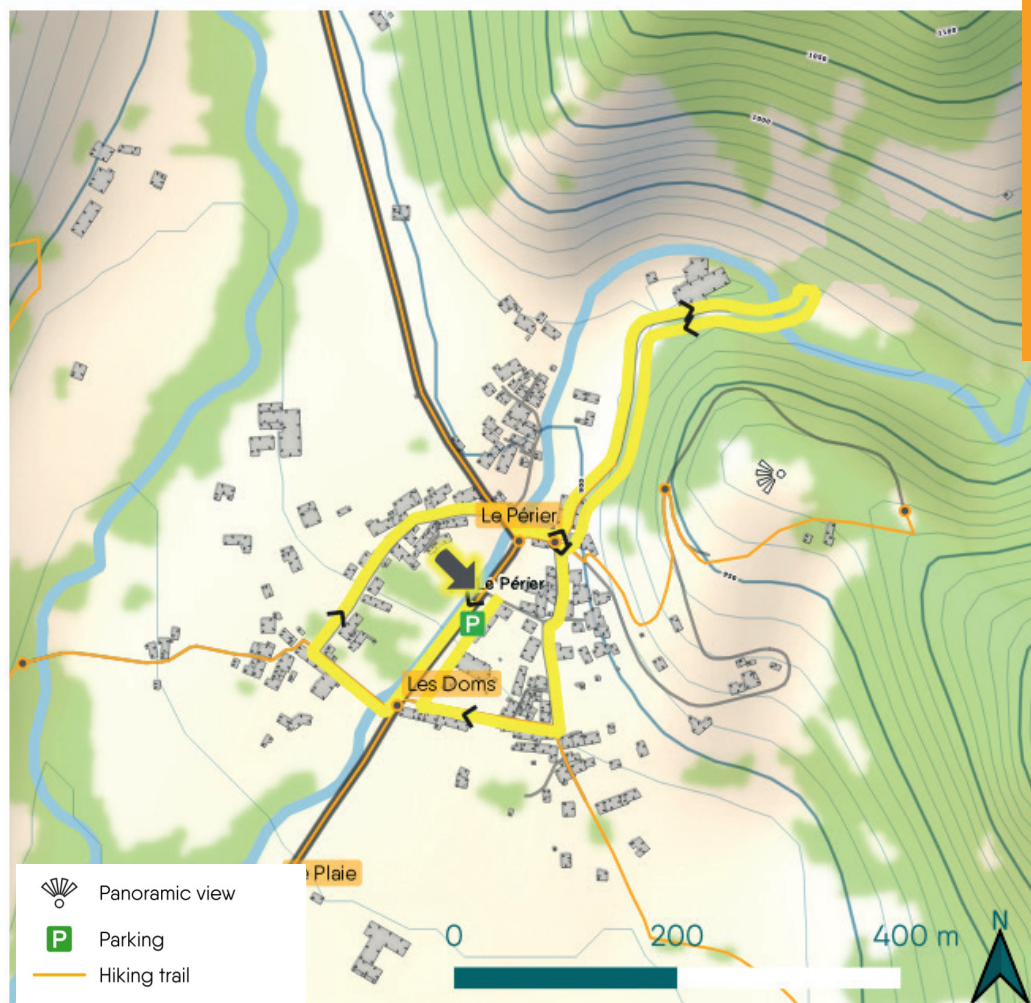

Path :

Departure from the café *Le Village* on the way of the *Col d'Ornon*. Then cross towards the *Chemin de la Drayre*. Go on the right on the *Rue des Blancs*, *Route de Confolens* over few meters, *Chemin de la Scierie* to the entrance of the *Parc National des Ecrins*. Turn around and go back by the *Chemin de la Scierie*. Cross the *Route de Confolens* to go to the *Rue des Bouleaux*, then go down the *Chemin des Doms* and the *Rue de la Cure*. Arrival at the café *Le Village*.

Some stickers of l'Echo des Vallées will indicate you the way when changing direction.
